The workshop also covered how to stay calm, assess danger, and make quick decisions in stressful situations.

On the occasion of World AIDS Day 2024, an AIDS Awareness Programme was organized on 3rd December 2024 under the joint collaboration of the Red Ribbon Club, Science Society and the NSS Unit of the college. The primary aim of the event was to raise awareness about AIDS, discuss preventive measures, and dispel misconceptions about the disease. The programme was honoured by the presence of the Principal, **Dr. Dinesh Singh Kanwar**, as the Chief Guest, and **Mr. Gopi Chand**, Health Educator from the Community Health Center, Ani, as the Special Guest. The main highlights of the event included a Quiz Competition, Poetry Recitation and Street Play by volunteers and an insightful lecture by Mr. Gopi Chand on the medical aspects of AIDS, its transmission, and prevention strategies. The chief guest, **Dr. Dinesh Singh Kanwar**, in his address motivated students to actively participate in creating societal awareness and take responsibility in addressing this global health challenge.

4th December 2024

A one day National Seminar on “Lok Sahitya Evm Sanskriti: Virasta, Navachar aur Prasangikta Ki Khoj” was organized by Sahitya Parishad & Sangeet Parishad of the college to explore the significance of traditional Indian literature and culture in shaping modern society. The event brought together scholars, cultural experts, and enthusiasts who discussed the deep connection between folk literature and cultural traditions, particularly in the context of rural and indigenous communities. The Principal, Dr. Dinesh Singh Kanwar was the Chief Guest of the Seminar. The Seminar commenced with an opening address by Keynote Speaker Dr. Surat Thakur, Retd. Associate Professor, Govt. Degree College Kullu who explained the role of folk literature in preserving oral traditions, customs, and wisdom passed down through generations which was followed by five technical sessions. The main highlights of the seminar were session led by Invited Speaker, Dr. Ashutosh Kumar Assistant Professor (Hindi), HPU Centre for Evening Studies and Sh. Naval Kishore, Assistant Professor (Sanskrit), Govt. College Seraj Lambathach. Around 60 research papers were presented in the seminar both online & offline mode from the Academicians, Researchers & Students from the different states of the country. In the one technical Session Dr. Surat Thakur, Pt. Vidyasagar & Sh. Rohit Thakur gave their live musical performance. The students of college presented the Folk Drama on the theme “Shivratri”. Students also presented the Kulluvi Folk Dance Nati. The Chief Guest, Dr. Dinesh Singh Kanwar gave an insightful lecture on the theme of Seminar and Cultural Performances. The seminar concluded with a call to action for both academics and cultural activists to further preserve and promote *Lok Sahitya* and *Sanskriti* in the digital age. The importance of integrating folk literature into modern educational systems and cultural programs was emphasized, encouraging a greater understanding of the diverse cultural fabric that shapes Indian society. The participants left with a renewed sense of appreciation for folk traditions and their potential to contribute to contemporary cultural discourse.

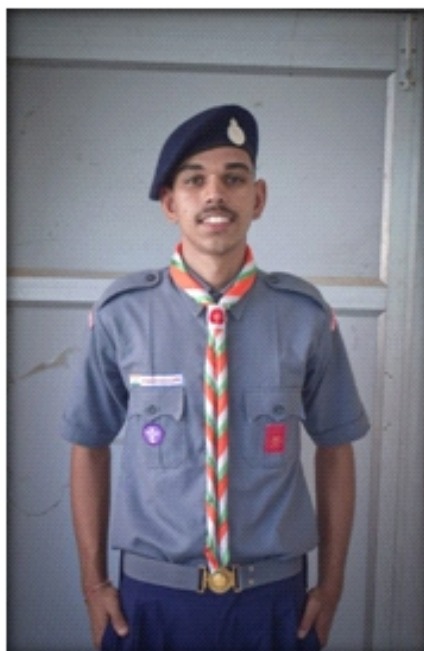
