

B. A. Political science– Programme Specific Outcomes

- ❖ The BA Political science program offers twelve courses in all. Students have to opt for **ten** courses viz:
 1. Four discipline specific courses **(DSC)** (two each in BA 1st and 2nd year);
 2. Four Skill Enhancement Courses **(SEC)** (two courses each in 2nd year and 3rd year);
 3. Two Discipline Specific Electives **(DSE)** in the third year of the BA programme.
- ❖ Students opting political science as DSC-II have to study 6-courses viz: four DSCs and two DSEs, respectively.
- ❖ The Political Science department also offers two Generic Electives **(GE)** in 3rd year ..
